## Preface

## "I measure the progress of a community by the degree of progress which women have achieved" – Dr. B. R. Ambedkar

Government of Tripura has recognized and addressed the issue of Women empowerment through various policies, programs, and initiatives. Government of Tripura is committed to creating an enabling environment for women to thrive and contribute to society on an equal footing with men.

The Tripura State Policy for empowerment of women 2022 has been launched for holistic development and empowerment of women in the state. The State Government is giving more emphasis on gender sensitive budget.

The budget under Social Welfare and Social Education department which looks after women and children, has been increased to 1508 crores in BE 2023-24 which is an increase of more than 22% over last year's Budget Allocation. In this budget, a new scheme namely "Mukhyamantri Konya Atmonirbhor Yojana" is announced to provide "free Scooty" to 100 girl toppers of Class-XII to motivate the girl students for higher education.

The State Government has waived off various type of fees like Admission fee, College Development fee, Exam fee etc. for girl students enrolled in Under Graduate/Post Graduate Courses in Govt. Degree Colleges. The State Government has launched "State Talent Search Scheme" for one time financial assistance of up to Rs. 5.00 lakhs to selected female athletes. The State Government will construct working women hostels at Agartala, Udaipur, Ambassa and Dharmanagar with total outlay of Rs. 15 Cr., two Women police stations have been sanctioned in Khowai and Dhalai District so that each district has minimum one Women PS.

The State Government has mobilized 4,13,456 rural women in 46017 self-help groups (SHGs) under DAY-NRLM, and provided with Rs. 424 Crores as revolving fund (RF) and community investment fund (CIF), and Rs. 725 Crores of bank credit for meeting various credit needs of such women Self Help Groups. At least 20% of such SHG members are identified as a "Lakhpati Didi". During FY 2023-24 more 80,000 rural women will be brought under SHGs.

The State Government has made arrangements to accommodate the children below the age of 6 years in special crèche, who have to accompany their respective mother (female inmates) in Prisons.

Gender budgeting aims to reduce gender disparities at all levels of policymaking and implementation and thus, this process aids to highlight initiatives, resources and expenditures of the Government Schemes after taking into account the requirements and priorities of women. This Gender budget highlights major women centric schemes and the outlay against such schemes.

Finance Department, Government of Tripura acknowledges the contribution of Social Welfare & Social Education Department, for providing necessary information for preparation of Gender Budget.


